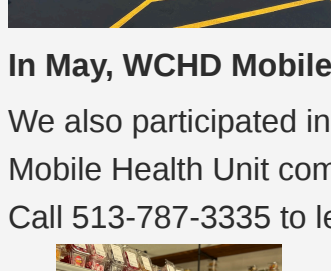

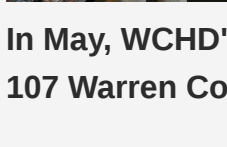
What was WCHD up to Last Month?



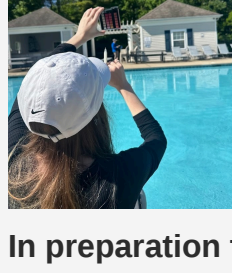
In May, WCHD Mobile Health made 8 regularly scheduled stops.

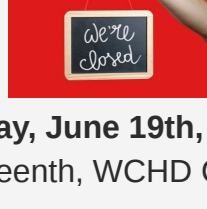

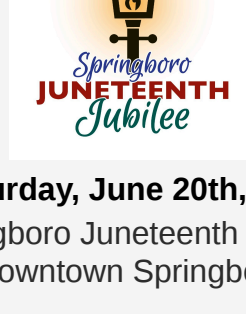

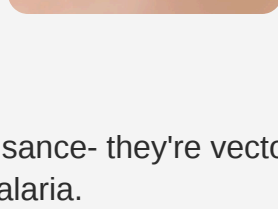

Mosquito Bite Prevention

Mosquitoes are more than a nuisance- they're vectors for serious illnesses like West Nile virus, dengue, and malaria.

The most effective defense starts with EPA-registered repellents containing DEET, picaridin, or oil of lemon eucalyptus, applied to exposed skin and clothing. Wear long sleeves and pants in light colors when spending time outdoors, especially at dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active.

Around your home, eliminate standing water in flowerpots, gutters, birdbaths, and other containers. Even a bottle cap's worth of water can become a mosquito breeding ground. Installing or repairing window and door screens adds another layer of protection indoors.

Combined, these simple habits can dramatically reduce your chances of getting bitten.

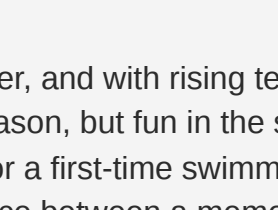


Did you know that you can get a Birth Certificate online at WCHD?

The Warren County Health District provides certified copies of birth records for all Ohio counties and death records for deaths occurring within Warren County excluding Atrium Hospital. The fee for all certified records is \$22.00 per copy. Checks and money orders should be made payable to the Warren County Health District.

For your convenience, you can process online requests through VitalDirector. All major credit cards accepted with an additional non-refundable convenience fee of \$4. Shipping options are available for an additional fee.

Pool Safety

Summer is just around the corner, and with rising temperatures comes the excitement of backyard pool season, but fun in the sun starts with safety. Whether you're a seasoned pool owner or a first-time swimmer, following basic pool safety practices can mean the difference between a memorable summer and a tragic one.

Always ensure young children are supervised by a designated adult watcher, never leaving them unattended, even for a moment. Install proper fencing with self-latching gates around the pool perimeter, keep life-saving equipment like a reaching pole and flotation ring nearby, and make sure all swimmers know their limits.

Learning CPR before the season kicks off is one of the best investments any pool household can make. As the days grow longer and the invitations to splash around become harder to resist, taking a few simple precautions ensures that this summer stays full of the right kind of splashes.
